Eligibility Criteria

The eligibility criteria to study Mass Communication in Australia for Indian students is as follows :-

- A student must be an Indian.
- A student should have completed minimum 12 years of schooling.
- Students should be proficient in English language. If not they need to prove their language proficiency by giving exams like IELTS or TOEFL and scoring to a required extent.
- The students should also provide evidences of funds available for the payment of their complete education and also health coverage during their stay in Australia.

Total Fees for Mass Communication Course in Australia

The bachelor in Mass Communication course is of the **duration 3 years**. The fees for this bachelor course in Australia is in between **Rs.11 to 20 Lac Per Year**. Thus, it would cost around Rs.35 to 60 Lac for the total course. If living expenses are added to the above cost then it would cost around Rs.80 Lacs to 1.2 Cr.

Similarly, the fees for the Master's in Mass Communication course are in between Rs. 14 to 20 lac for one year and the course duration is 1.5 to 2 years. Thus, the total fees for would be in between Rs. 25 to 40 lacs. Adding other living expenses etc. the total cost of a masters course in Mass Communication will be around Rs. 35- 80 lacs.

Law

Studying Law prepares you for a career in Law. The law degrees can have world-wide, international and local aspects. There are many different types of law degrees available, and it is depending upon where you choose to study. The degrees in law are like LLB, Juris Doctor (JD) and Masters of Laws (LLM). Students can specialize in one particular area of practice by pursuing LLM.

- 2. The students who study from the law schools in Australia, will be eligible to do legal practice in Australia.

Eligibility Criteria

The eligibility criteria to study Law in Australia for Indian students is as follows :-

- A student must be an Indian.
- A student should have completed minimum 12 years of schooling and should have a 12th standard certificate equivalent to Year 12 certificate in Australia.
- Students should be proficient in English language. If not they need to prove their language proficiency by giving exams like IELTS or TOEFL or Pearson test of English (PTE) or University of Cambridge - Advanced (CAE) and scoring to a required extent.
- Some universities may ask to appear students for their tests (designed by the individual university or law school) and essay writing etc.

Total Fees for Law

The bachelor in law course is generally of the duration 3 years. The fees for this bachelor course in law in Australia is in between 5 to 20 lac per year. Thus, it would cost around Rs.15 to 60 Lac for the total course. If living expenses are added to the above cost then it would cost around Rs.60 Lac to 1.2 Cr.

Similarly, the fees for the Master's in law course or PhD in law are in between Rs. 7 to 40 Lac for one year and the course duration is 2 years. Thus, the total fees would be in between Rs.16 to 90 Lacs. Adding living expenses etc. the total cost of a masters course in Law in Australia will be around Rs.30 lacs to 1.3 Cr.
